PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

2. Allowable Service(s) Assurance

How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

These needs will be determined by the LEA administrative team consisting of district and school level administrators. Student data as well as individual school's needs assessments will be analyzed, monitored and prioritized in developing the plan for using these funds.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

Muscle Shoals City Schools will assess and address learning gaps in the individual classroom setting through formative and summative assessments. Our system will also continue to use results from progress monitoring assessments (STAR) to assists teachers in diagnosing learning issues for students and to prescribe appropriate instruction and intervention.

What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

Our plan is to use the funds as soon as they are available for use. We plan to put all of our technology purchases (software maintenance agreements, Chromebook protection covers, and additional ACCESS points—see description below) into use immediately. It will also be necessary for our system to purchase the safety/cleaning supplies (hand sanitizer, thermometers, disinfectant, gloves, masks, and soap) as soon as possible. Our system will also use these funds to provide a Mental Health Coordinator, nursing services as well as instructional interventions. All services will conclude by September 30, 2022.

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

Muscle Shoals City Schools will provide expanded and enhanced technology usage through the purchase of various software maintenance agreements for all grades and protection covers for Chromebooks as part of our 1 to 1 technology initiative that provides every student access to a technological device at home if necessary. We will also use the funds to provide additional ACCESS points outside of our schools to allow students the opportunity for internet use without needing access to the inside of the buildings. We will also use funds for salaries and benefits for interventions and instruction for after-school remote learning.

The private school (Covenant Christian School) has a plan in place to utilize these funds to purchase supplies as well as clinical, health and safety needs. We have consulted with Covenant Christian School throughout the process to complete the application and we met to discuss/review the private school portion of the application as well as the process for purchases. The initial amount of \$21,664.49 was based on total enrollment percentages from our system and Covenant Christian. After recalculating based on poverty numbers in January, the new amount for equitable services is \$13,208.20. The original budget for Covenant Christian School included only Items that were consumable and we are unable to retrieve any of those items therefore the total original amount will remain allocated to the private school. We will apply the budget reflected in the current amended Equitable Services Implementation Form.

OTHER ASSURANCES AND CERTIFICATIONS

4. Other Assurances and Certifications

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies the following:

- The LEA that receives ESSER funds will, to the greatest extent practicable, continue to compensate its employees and contractors during the period of any disruptions or closures related to COVID-19 in compliance with Section 18006 of Division B of the CARES Act. In addition, LEAs that accept funds will continue to pay employees and contractors to the greatest extent practicable based on the unique financial circumstances of the LEA. CARES Act funds generally will not be used for bonuses, merit pay, or similar expenditures, unless related to disruptions or closures resulting from COVID-19.

 - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and

6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

The LEA provides Chromebooks for all students in the district. The software purchased with the funds will be installed as appropriate on all school devices. All students will be able to utilize the wireless access points with the devices provided by the district. The personal protective equipment and supplies will be provided equitably to all students and employees as needed to ensure health and safety.
